It is therefore ordered that all persons interested in said estate appear before me at a District Court to be held in the City of Plattsmouth, in said county, on the 9th day of April, 1923, at 10 o'clock a. m., to show cause, if any there be, why a license should not be granted to said guardian to sell so much of the above described real estate of said incompetent as shall be necessary to pay said debts and expenses.

It is further ordered that a copy of this order shall be published in the Plattsmouth Journal, a semi-weekly newspaper circulating in said county, three successive weeks prior to the date of hearing thereof.
