BEER AND ROYALTY
 The German empire was a federation of many states dominated by the super-state of Prussia. Most of the German states were monarchies, but three of them—Bremen, Hamburg and Lubeck—were republics.
 The German republic is also a federation including most of the states that were parts of the old empire, except that the small Thuringian states have republican governments, but at least one of them is inclining very strongly toward the restoration of monarchy. Can Bavaria, as a kingdom, form a part of the federated German republics as Hamburg and Lubeck, republics, former parts of the Hohenzollern empire?
 A majority of the people of Bavaria appear to favor a restoration of the Wittelsbach dynasty. They are restrained from making Bavaria a kingdom by the fear of serious complications with the rest of Germany, and also by the very common-sense attitude of Prince Rupprecht, the Wittelsbach heir.
 "I will not," says Rupprecht, "accept the crown of Bavaria until beer is sold for 29 pfennings the stein!"
 The connection between beer and royalty may not be instantly apparent, but it is none the less, Bavarian beer sells for 40 pfennings, and Rupprecht as king could not bring down the price. He could not lower the cost of living, could not reduce taxation, could not find work for the unemployed. He realizes his inability to perform such miracles, and knows his failures to restore pre-war conditions would be a source of general disappointment. Does he insist that something approaching pre-war conditions must be attained before he will consent to be king?
 Germany is fortunate that the head of the Wittelsbachs is a level-headed citizen. A reactionary might do much to upset a dissatisfied state that insists on calling itself the "royal republic of Bavaria." And the upsetting of Bavaria might upset the whole German federation.
