Forest Growth Can be Increased by Protection

Government Urges Greater Efforts to Increase Forestry Resources of the Country

The annual growth of wood products in the forests of the United States can be increased steadily, according to the Forest Service, United States Department of Agriculture, to more than four times its present volume. Adequate protection from fire plus grade forestry practice would increase the present estimated annual growth of six billion cubic feet per year to ten billion by 1950, and intensive management of our forests as crops may be expected ultimately to result in an annual yield of more than twenty-seven billion cubic feet.
