



### PARTY SUPPORT IS URGED

Americus, Ga., July 26 .- Declaring that those who abandon the democratic party in the November election will not have entered any new movement "but will have joined forces with the ancient enemy," United States Senator Walter F. George in an address this afternoon at union schoolhouse in Webster county made a ringing appeal for strict loyalty to the democratic national ticket. It was his first public address since the Houston convention

"The public affairs of this country always have been conducted thru political parties." If we break down the party system we will go in all directions and get nowhere. Of course it is silly and idle for any intelligent man to say that his party can never be wrong. Party loyalty after all is based upon love of country, and parties should be held strictly responsible for the government of our country."

"Governor Smith went into that convention as I did." said the senator, "He was faced by the twothirds rule. He took his chances with the rest of us. I did not agree then, do not agree now, and never expect to agree with Governor Smith on many vital issues, yet he is the regular nominee of a regular democratic convention.

"The democratic party is the traditional party of the south. It is the party that protected us during the reconstructional days that tried the souls of men and women. It is the party that has preserved white rule

"If under the dictates of our cousciences you feel that you ought to abandon the démocratic party, of course you have the right to do so, but I want to remind you that you are not joining any new movement.
