The official bond of Ralph Meisinger, road overseer for Eight Mile Grove precinct, was approved by the Board.

Resolution: Whereas, a petition signed by more than 51 per cent of the resident freeholders of Greenwood precinct, Cass county, Nebraska, was filed in the office of the County Clerk of Cass county, Nebraska, on the 10th day of November, 1928, requesting the Board of County Commissioners of Cass county, Nebraska, to levy an assessment for one year not to exceed 2.2 mills on the dollar upon the actual valuation of taxable property in said Greenwood precinct for the purpose of improving the highway commencing at the north limits of the Village of Alvo on the highway running between Sections 34 and 35, Township 11, Range 9, and extending north along said highway as the same runs between Sections 26 and 27, Sections 22 and 23, Sections 15 and 14, and Sections 3 and 2, all in Township 11, Range 9, Cass county, Nebraska, by placing gravel thereon; and

Whereas, the Register of Deeds of Cass county, Nebraska, has filed a statement with the County Clerk certifying that more than 51 per cent of the resident freeholders of said Greenwood precinct have signed the said petition; and

Whereas, the Board of County Commissioners are willing to help on a graveling program; therefore

Be it Resolved by the Board of Commissioners of Cass county, Nebraska, that the county furnish half the expense as long as funds are available to gravel on county roads to connect towns to gravel on Federal, State or county roads.

The plan being to connect all feeder roads to the main highway, the county paying half of the expense, and the other half to be furnished locally by donation or by precinct tax.

Be it resolved that said petition be granted and a levy of 2.2 mills be made for the year 1929 in accordance with the provisions of the Session Laws of 1927, Chapter 171.

Moved by Gorder and seconded by Harris that the Resolution be adopted. Motion carried by the following vote: Gorder, aye; Harris, aye; Spangler, aye; and the Resolution adopted this 5th day of December, 1928.
