## CONTEMPT OF COURT

Two Cleveland newspaper editors were sentenced to jail because they July, 1929. dared to criticize a Federal judge for his refusal to grant an injunction to restrain gambling at a race track.

Race track gambling is a crime under the laws of the state of Ohio. This alone was sufficient justification for the criticism, no matter how harsh it may have been.

The newspaper editors were not in contempt of court, but the Federal judge unquestionably has a feeling of contempt for the statutes of door of the court house in the City the state of Ohio.
