In entering an order refusing to deliver the guns back to the United States government, Judge Browne said he was taking "judicial cognizance of the many murderous assaults that have been committed by federal officers and others and the necessity of preventing the same."

The judge denied a motion by Federal Attorney Hughes for return of the weapons, and in his order further set forth that he "has no assurance that if these two guns, which were used to murder an innocent citizen, be returned, the war department will not wrongfully entrust them to other murderously inclined
