

gion, comprising about 600 specinens, has been completed and the exhibit is now open to the public at the Chicago Academy of Sciences. The collection includes birds which have seen within a 50-mile radius of Chicago during the last 75 years, according to Alfred M. Balley, director of the academy.

"Being on Lake Michigan and also in the Mississippi Valley, the Chicago area is in the heart of a wonderful bird country," Mr. Bailey said. "From the sand dunes along the lake shore outheast of Chicago we get the piping plover, sandpipers, and seagulls during migration. From the marshy regions west of Chicago come the red-wing blackbirds, rails, least litterns, coots, grebes and American offerns. The year-round residents include cardinals, blue jays, crows, horned owls, and screech owls. "The robins, wrens and bluebirds


