The Plattsmouth high school football team Friday afternoon staged a fine exhibition of the gridiron sport at Tecumseh, holding the fast and aggressive team of that place to a small score. The Tecumseh team winning by the score of 13 to 0.

The scoring of Tecumseh occurred in the first half of the game, they making a touchdown in the first and second periods.

In the opening quarter Tecumseh completed a number of passes that carried the ball into the Plattsmouth territory. Story taking the ball from the Plattsmouth two foot line and smashing through for the touchdown. The pass for the extra point was good, placing Tecumseh out in front by the score of 7 to 0.

In the second period more passes for good gains were completed, mixed with off tackle plays that brought the ball down to striking distance of the Plattsmouth goal and where Story was able to smash the line for the additional touchdown but the try for extra point failed.

The efforts of the Tecumseh stars to remain in to battle the smaller and lighter team, a passing attack being used by Plattsmouth that gained much ground. Tecumseh's fumble of the ball, recovered by Plattsmouth, for a moment looked dark for the host team, but on a fast and well placed pass from Hitz to Garnett, the ball just rolled off the finger of the Plattsmouth lineman standing on Tecumseh goal line and the show was blown up.

In the ground gaining and offensive Hone looked the best for the locals, the Hitter fullback smashing the heavy line of Tecumseh for substantial gains.

Both teams suffered from the effects of the slippery field.

This was the last game of the Plattsmouth team until Thanksgiving day they play Nebraska City here in the annual clash of the two schools, the finale of the season.
