James Rivett. a Veteran Rail Man, Passes On

Was Well Known Here and for Many Years Supervisor of Building Construction for "Q"

James Rivett, 80, retired supervisor of building construction of the Burlington, died at 9:30 Tuesday at the home of his son, Harry, at Omaha. He had been ill since fall and had recently been taken from his home at Lincoln to that of the son

Mr. Rivett was a well known figure in the Burlington circles of Nebraska and was a frequent visitor here in the years past when he was active in the affairs of the road.

Mr. Rivett, who was 80 years old, etired Dec. 31, 1922, after forty-two and a half years service with the Burlington. He had lived in Lincoln more than fifty years. Since retiring, he and Mrs. Rivett had traveled extensively in America and Europe, having visited his birthplace in England in 1928.

Born at Podington, Bedfordshire, England, Mr. Rivett was educated in parish schools there and served his apprenticeship with an English construction company for four years.
