Iowa, Federal Relief Plans Reach Farmer

Limiting of Small Grain, With Seed Corn and Rapidly Growing Forage Included.

Des Moines, Oct. 12.—A "preventive relief" program designed to "save millions next year by spending thousands now" was launched in Iowa Friday, following a conference between Governor Clyde L. Herring and federal relief officials.

Described as "the cheapest possible means of effecting rural rehabilitation," the program involves co-operation of state relief headquarters, county committees, and the state department of agriculture.

It is aimed at preventing a recurrence of conditions of distress existing on Iowa farms last summer during the drouth and the chinch bug invasion. Details were being worked out by Herring, E. M. Mulock, director of emergency relief, and two other federal relief officials, Prof. George Keller and W. J. Albers.

Assures Seed Corn.
Immediate steps include:
1. Buying thousands of bushels of corn for seed for next spring and feed for work teams.
2. Development of a fast-growing temporary forage crop to plant on bare meadows of southern Iowa counties.
3. Limiting small grain acreage in southern Iowa to forestall a possible chinch bug invasion in 1935.

Assurance that enough seed corn would be available for all southern Iowa planting needs was given by Governor Herring and federal officials.

A survey by county committees was started Friday to determine seed and other relief needs on all primary drouth area farms.

Distribution of soy bean and other forage crop seed is planned for next spring to supply southern Iowa needs.

Cut Small Grain Area.
Albers said limiting the small grain acreage is the only way to save the corn if the chinch bug situation becomes serious.

Cost of the program was not announced, but officials said it would be far less than expenditures for drouth relief in 1934, which were: Chinch bug oil, \$350,000; feed corn, \$348,000; wheat, \$156,725; hay, \$40,750; sudan grass seed, \$12,574; soy bean seed, \$127,000. In addition costs were incurred to support farmers who moved to towns following the drouth and chinch bug scourges.

While this rally is primarily to interest the younger democrats in the campaign, it is also open to anyone interested in the success of the democratic party, regardless of age, and the general public is invited.

Although all of the county candidates will be in attendance, no speaking program is planned other than perhaps a few informal and impromptu remarks by the candidates so desiring.
