Wm. McHugh, Jr. Named Jury Commissioner

Deposed by Governor Bryan as Election Commissioner, Selected by Omaha Judges.

Omaha.—District Judges at their annual meeting here unanimously voted to continue William McHugh, Jr., as jury commissioner for Douglas county. McHugh recently was deposed as election commissioner by Governor Bryan, who named Anton Tusa to succeed him.

It has been the custom to elect the election commissioner to the post of jury commissioner. Action on McHugh was regarded as a direct thrust at Bryan, whose action in appointing Tusa had been attacked editorially as dragging the election commissioner into politics for the first time in history.

The group re-elected Judge John W. Yeager presiding judge and announced all of the other judges would remain in the courts they occupied during 1934. The post of jury commissioner pays \$1,000 per year.
