Corn-Hog Checks Pass Three Million Dollar Mark

Fifty Counties Have Received at Least Part of Their Second Payment So Far.

Lincoln, Neb., Feb. 3. - Second corn-hog payments to Nebraska farmers signing 1934 contracts now total-\$3,084,363.79, the weekly report from state AAA headquarters here shows. Nearly 50 counties now have received at least part of their second payment and other checks are arriving daily.

Cuming county has received the most payments thus far in second checks, totaling \$226,358. First payments there were \$338,558.
