## Settlement is Made in C. P. Hall Estate

Widow Receives the Sum of \$22,500 by Agreement Made With Her Five Children.

Settlement by which Mrs. Charles P. Hall is to receive \$22,500 from the Charles P. Hall estate, was approved by County Judge Earl of Lancaster county at Lincoln Wednesday. The settlement was reached between the five children of Mr. Hall and the widow, who was Mr. Hall's second wife. Mr. Hall died June 25, 1928.

Mrs. Hall received a fourth of the estate, her legal share under the statute and the children the other three-fourths. The division of property was made by turning over to Mrs. Hall \$22,500 in cash and the balance of the \$22,500 in securities held by Mr. Hall at the time of his death.

The agreement for settlement of the estate marked the close of much litigation that had resulted from the successful attempt of the five children to place the estate under guardianship last in 1928. Mr. Hall was then seventy-nine years old. He had then been recently married a second time. His former wife had died two years before. The estate at that time was estimated to be worth \$250,000. The present settlement with the widow was for a net amount of \$22,500.

The fight over the guardianship of Mr. Hall was argued three times at the supreme court. He fought it valiantly and claimed he was competent to take care of his property. The children contended that he was not competent and that the property he had accumulated would be wasted. The case was sent back to the district court and the final outcome was that Mr. Hall was placed under guardianship.

At the time he was placed under guardianship he had a large amount of securities in a tin box in his house in Lincoln. Mr. Hall was a Cass county resident for many years and was recognized as an excellent business man. The land in the estate amounted to 1750 acres and of this 950 acres are in Cass county, 80 in Lancaster and 1,100 in Hitchcock county. Of the latter around 300 acres was under water in the recent Republican valley flood.

The children are: Edwin K., Myrl P., Walter, Flora Schick, and Julia Luff of near Greenwood, Lyman S. and Elmer J. Hall, Trenton and Luther C. Hall, living in Arkansas. The attorneys in the case were C. E. Sanden and Bernard Bradwohl representing the children; Chambers and Hall representing Mrs. Hall and Herbert Baird representing the First Trust company, executor. While Mr. Hall was under guardianship John J. Ledwith was his guardian.

## C. M. T. C. Boys Firing on U. S. Rifle Range

Civilian Youths in Months' Training Have Period Given to Practice With Automatic Rifle.

The United States government rifle range is a place of real miniature warfare today as the members of the Civilian Military Training camp at Fort Crook are here for their firing tests. There are 420 in the group. The youthful students are given firing tests with the automatic rifle at the local range and some excellent scores are reported from the tests, the advanced classes especially showing excellent work in their range records.

The school of fire is under the direction of Col. Sutherland, commanding officer of the Seventeenth Infantry and of the C. M. T. C. forces, with the active firing practice in charge of the officers and non-commissioned officers of the regiment. The work on machine gun and pistol will be held at the Fort Crook range and will be taken up as soon as the rifle practice is over.

The deceased came to this city in his youth and attended the services of the Burlington in the local shops and remained here until transferred to the Wymore division of the railroad in the car rental shops at Wymore. He was well known among the older residents of this city and who will share with the family the regret that his passing has occasioned.

Mr. Ackerman is survived by the widow, two daughters, Mrs. Edna Perry of Lincoln, Miss Violet and one son, Edward Ackerman, Jr., of Wymore.

The body will be brought here Sunday evening from the late home and will lay in state at the Saffrey funeral home until Monday afternoon when the funeral services will be held at 2:30. Interment will be at the Oak Hill cemetery.
