GEORGE EDMUND FOSS DEAD

Chicago.-George Edmund Foss 2, former Illinois congressman whose interest in naval affairs wor him the title of Father of the American Navy, died Sunday at his suburban home. Foss was a member of the committee on foreign affairs for four years. In 1902 Foss conceived the idea of establishing the great lakes naval training station at suburban North Chicago and induced group of citizens to donate land as site for the project. Twice he was candidate for the senate on the re publican ticket, in 1908 and again in 1918, but was defeated both times.
