

Commissioners Vote Approval of River Dock

Pass Resolution Allocating \$1,506 of Poor Relief Funds to Job to Match \$23,000 Federal.

The Cass county commissioners at their meeting April 9 passed a resolution allocating \$1,506 of poor relief funds to the construction of a dock and wharf on the Missouri river at Plattsmouth...

The total cost of this improvement is estimated at \$23,828, which means a federal expenditure of \$22,322, as against the \$1,506 pledged by the county. Plans for the project have been drawn and submitted to the War Department for final approval.

In addition to the county's contribution of \$1,506 for work relief wages on the job, the government will also furnish \$8,120 for that purpose, the balance of the cost being for material.

The resolution was introduced by Commissioner Pitz, seconded by Commissioner Gorder and unanimously carried.

At this same meeting the commissioners approved applications for rural bed licenses to O. E. McDonald, Manley (unincorporated); Ashley O. Ault, Cedar Creek (unincorporated) and Chas. V. Barrows and Byron C. Cohn for places located outside the incorporated limits of this city, to the south and north, respectively, along highway 75.

A claim of Mary M. Davis for refund of \$81.60 school tax for year 1935 on account of alleged too high valuation was disallowed.

Reports from the various county officials for the first quarter, ending April 1, were received, as follows: County Judge \$933.80, Reg. of Deeds 557.25, Clerk District Court 242.45, County Sheriff 587.50, County Jail 87.75.

In addition, there was a supplemental report of fees collected by the sheriff during the second quarter of 1935, in the amount of \$92.29, which had not been included in the original report for that quarter.
