In all probability Waverly will play here in the zone finals, Saturday afternoon, August 22nd at 3 o'clock.

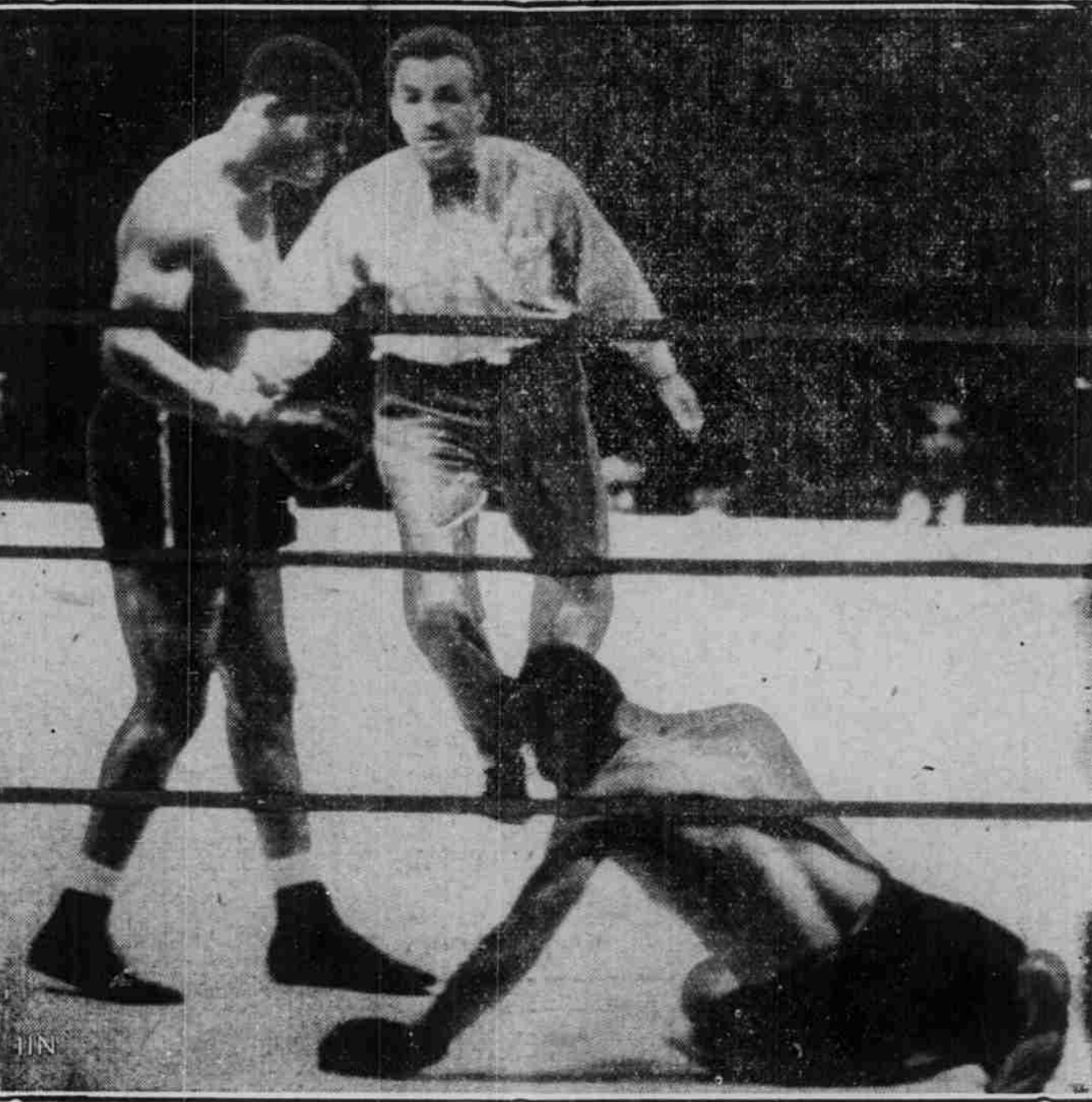
### ATTEND FAMILY REUNION
