Mrs. Keyser Dies at 95. Mrs. Malissa Keyser, former resident of near Union, died last Thursday afternoon at the home of her youngest daughter, Mrs. Chris Petersen, in Omaha. She had not been active for four years, but had been confined to bed only a few months. Mrs. Keyser was past 95 years of age, the mother of 15 children of whom 11, including a son 79 years old, are still living. A few years ago on Mother's day, she declared that not one of her children had ever caused her any sorrow. Mrs. Keyser has so many descendants that the family has lost count, but relatives state they number 189, including several great-great grandchildren. When she was 15, she was married at Sidney, Iowa, to William Preston Keyser. Three children were born before the civil war. She cared for them alone while her husband served with union forces. Names of Cass County Towns in Many States

Plattsmouth, Alvo, Manley, Mynard, Nehawka, Weeping Water, Stand Alone in Postoffice Records.

While a half dozen of Cass county's seventeen towns can lay claim to being the only postoffice in the United States with their respective names, on the other hand there are nearly 100 other towns in the union with names identical with names of other Cass county towns. Plattsmouth, Alvo, Manley, Mynard, Nehawka and Weeping Water are the six towns who alone can claim individuality of name. The claim of Manley is somewhat obscured by the fact that there are Manly's in Iowa and North Carolina. Uncle Sam's postal guide, which curiously this information, is also authority for the fact that there are nine Cass counties in the U. S. Other states having a Cass county are Illinois, Indiana, Iowa, Michigan, Minnesota, Missouri, North Dakota and Texas.

The town of Union has to share the name with towns in 19 other states; Greenwood being runner-up, having namesakes in 17 other states. Cedar Creek has a twin in Texas. It's only competitor for the name, although there is a Cedar creek, Missouri. Other Cass county towns have namesakes as follows: Avoca, 10; Eagle, 7; Elmwood, 9; Louisville, 9; Murdock, 4; Murray, 6; South Bend, 4; Wabash, 2. Thirty-seven other states besides Nebraska are represented by the towns of similar names to Cass county's towns.
