

### Plan Campaign of Education on Tax Payments

Cass County to Join in Statewide Move to Assist in Securing Payment of Taxes.

The board of county commissioners at their session Tuesday afternoon voted to take up the plan of tax education that has been sponsored by the Nebraska State press association and the newspapers of the state. This plan is by display advertising and articles pointing out the advantages of the citizen in making their tax payments to avoid high interest rates, to take advantage of the new laws which give more opportunity for the citizen to pay their taxes under the very liberal provisions of the laws.

The securing of the payment of the taxes now outstanding and accumulating will also aid in making possible the reduction of taxes by the increasing revenue.

The first of these series will appear in the Journal the coming week and will also be published in the Nehawka Enterprise, Weeping Water Republican, Louisville Courier and Elmwood Leader-Echo, all of these papers joining in the campaign to help secure the payment of taxes.
