DEATH STOPS SUIT. FALLS CITY, Neb., Jan. 19 (UP)—As a result of the murder in St. Joseph last night of E. E. Robertson Heads Bar Committee

Supreme Court Names Grievance Committees for Each of Eighteen Judicial Districts in State.

LINCOLN, Jan. 18 (UP)—The supreme court today appointed grievance committees for each of the 18 judicial districts in Nebraska to sift complaints of "unprofessional conduct" on the part of attorneys.

The committee will form a part of the new machinery for disciplining attorneys under the "integrated" bar of Nebraska.

Previously, complaints were submitted to the attorney general who, if he found merit in them, filed a motion for disbarment on the disciplining in the court. The court then appointed a referee to conduct a hearing and the entire expense was borne by the attorney general's litigation fund.

Under the new plan, complaints will be submitted to the grievance committee which may refer the charges directly to the supreme court. The court may appoint a special mayor to conduct a trial for the accused lawyer. The entire expense, including payment for services of the attorney to prosecute the case will be paid by the Nebraska Bar association. Every lawyer in the state must join the bar association and pay dues of \$5 annually if he is engaged actively in practice.

The committee consisted of three members of all except Lancaster and Douglas county districts where the membership is five. First named member in each group is committee chairman. The committee include: Dist. No. 1, John H. Wiltse, Falls City; Kenneth S. Wherry, Pawnee City and Lee Kelliger, Auburn.

KEARNEY DEBT FREE. KEARNEY, Jan. 18 (UP)—The city of Kearney which owed more than \$1,000,000 in 1924 is now out of debt.

The last remaining debt \$4,000 in waterworks bonds was paid today out of surplus from plant earnings. Water Commissioner J. S. Bowker reported to the city council.
