In the clash between strikers and officers at the plant of the Pressed Steel Car company in Schoenville, Pa., a score of persons were seriously wounded, three strikers and two officers were killed.

The town of Decatur, Ill., was visited by fire. Property valued at \$1,000,000 was destroyed.

J. C. Godfrey, mayor of Davisboro, Ga., was perhaps fatally wounded in an attack made upon him by the brother of the man upon whom he had inflicted a fine.

A cablegram from Rheims, France, carried by the Associated Press says: "Glenn H. Curtiss, the American aviator, and M. Paulham, representing France, divided the honors of the second day of aviation week, the former with a thrilling flight just before dusk, in which he lowered the speed record for the course, which measures 6 1-5 miles, to 8 minutes 35 2-5 seconds; the latter making two impressive high altitude flights in the endurance test for the prix de la champagne."

This is an Associated Press dispatch from Austin, Texas: "Robert J. Eckhart, receiver for the Waters-Pierce Oil company, filed an inventory of the corporation's Texas property with the clerk of the district court here. Judge Wilcox will now order the sale of the property to the highest bidder. The Waters-Pierce holdings in this state are valued at \$2,000,000, which is the amount of the fine recently imposed for alleged violations of the Texas anti-trust statutes."

In an automobile accident near Council Bluffs, Iowa, one person was killed while four were seriously injured.

Captain William H. Cushing aged 61, senior captain of the revenue cutter service on the Pacific coast, is dead.

The Washington correspondent for the Associated Press says that the United States is the second naval power in the world. Great Britain is first.

African advices say that on August 23, Colonel Roosevelt went out alone and killed one elephant.

Henri Fournier, a French aviator, was seriously injured by falling from his machine, while making a test at Rheims, France.

Wall Street has been informed that E. H. Harriman will retire from active work.

Marian Roberta Bleakley, known as the "incubator baby" is the subject of legal proceedings at Kansas City. It is charged that she was kidnapped by her foster mother, Mrs. Barclay, and Mrs. Bleakley, who claims to be her real mother, seeks possession of her.

A New York dispatch to the Chicago Record-Herald says: "Charles Alfred Byrne, journalist and playwright, died today of appendicitis in a Jersey City hospital. He figured prominently in the Garfield campaign of 1880, as publisher of the newspaper in which appeared the forged Morey letter, purporting to give

General James A. Garfield's views on the question of Chinese labor. The Morey letter was the most sensational incident in an exciting presidential campaign. The letter was denounced by General Garfield as a forgery. Byrne and three men associated with him were arrested. It
