The State Convention.

The convention met on the 10th, the committee on credentials reported 49 counties, represented by 257 delegates. The Lincoln county contest was settled by admitting both delegations (consisting of two members each) to seats and votes in the convention. Hon. J. W. Dawes of Saline county, was elected permanent chairman, and Maj. D. H. Wheeler, of Cass, permanent secretary, with J. A. MacMurphy for assistant.

A motion to appoint a committee on platform was tabled. Nominations for the office of Supreme Judge being declared in order, the names of Gen. A. H. Connor, A. C. Turner, Hon. E. J. Brown, Judge Lake, Gen. Cobb and Judge Clinton Briggs were placed before the convention as candidates.

The convention then placed in nomination, for members at large, Messrs. Amasa Cobb, J. W. Dawes, R. Rosewater, Lorenzo Crouse, M. L. Hayward, W. H. Michael, Crouse, Cobb, Hayward and Michael all declined, leaving Dawes and Rosewater the only two candidates.

A call of counties was made when Mr. Dawes was found to be elected by the following: E. Rosewater..... 83 J. W. Dawes..... 117 Mr. Dawes was declared elected chairman of the Republican Central Committee.
