Medical Topography of Nebraska. We reprint the following as a matter of general interest. Many persons do not know the thorough healthfulness of our climate and it is a subject that concerns all who contemplate making Nebraska their home.

Dr. Merceur of Nebraska, writing on the Medical Topography of the country says: The elevation of the land at Plattsmouth, on the Missouri river, is 910 feet above low water of the Gulf of Mexico, and at Kearney Junction City, the western terminus of the Burlington and Missouri River Railway the elevation of 2,114 feet. At Pine Bluffs, on the western boundary of the State, the elevation is 5,625 feet. From the south eastern corner of the State, the elevation is gradual to the west and north, at the rate of about 7 feet to the mile. The soil is made up of vegetable mould, silica, clay, lime, and occasionally some bicarbonate of soda, and the whole mass constitutes a black loam. The sub-soil consists of silica, clay, carbonate of lime, and in the western parts of the State, some bicarbonate of soda.
