RED CLOUD, NEBR., July 30, A. D. 1910.
The board of Webster County Commissioners met pursuant to adjournment. Members all present.
On motion the following claims on the Poor Farm were allowed, and the County Clerk instructed to draw warrants on the Poor Farm fund in payment of same. Elmer Wilson Supt. Poor Farm for sundry purposes \$50.00. Albright Bros. for goods furnished Poor Farm \$16.73.
In the matter of the lots owned in the Red Cloud Cemetery by Webster County Nebr., the County Board of said Cemetery requested the Board of Commissioners to make an allowance of \$2 per year to take care of said lots. On motion the above and foregoing request was granted.
In the matter of checking up and settling with the several county officers for the first half of the ensuing year. The chairman of the County Board appointed the following named Commissioners, James Overman and G. W. Hummel as a committee to check up with the County Clerk, Clerk of the District Court, County Judge, County Superintendent, and County Sheriff of Webster County.
G. Olmstede, L. Schmidt and T. J. Chaplin as a committee to check up and settle with County Treasurer.
On motion the official bond of C. W. Fulton as overseer of highways in and for Road District No. 16 Harmony precinct, Webster County, Neb., was approved.
Complaint having been made on behalf of the citizens of Rosemont, respecting disorderly conduct. On motion Commissioner Chaplin was appointed with authority to investigate and take such action as he deems advisable and report to the board.
On motion board adjourned to July 28th, 1910.

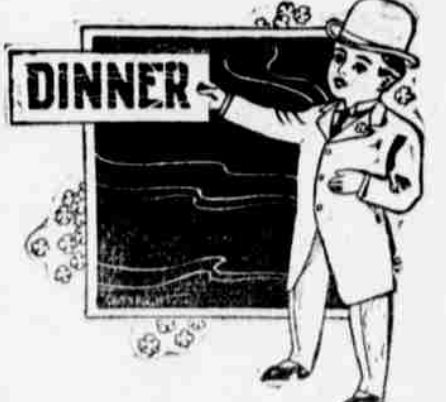
