There is no let up on the Allied Fronts. Let it be plainly seen and understood that there is no let up here at home. Save sugar, save wheat, save clothing, save meat. The vision of oncoming peace must not obscure the fact that the war beast though wounded is still loose. Autocracy must be smashed beyond any possibility of recovery. Then the Allies will be in position to dictate terms that will assure the future safety of democracy.

Coming rapidly to the front by reason of late developments is the question whether the warring Germans shall or can be treated as human beings and be permitted to mingle commercially and socially in the family of nations after the collapse of their murderous assault on the civilized world. Pledges are already being published and circulated in the United States whereby the signer agrees for a period of twenty-five years not to purchase or use anything "made in Germany."

Representative Scott Ferris, Chairman of the Democratic National Congressional Campaign Committee, speaking at the Iowa Democratic State Convention, said:

"There is but one issue before the Nation this day. That is to lift aloft the banner of democracy and maintain the freedom of mankind and to stamp out once and for all German militarism and German autocracy. There may be other ways to achieve this, but I know of only this one. That is to stand by the regularly constituted officers of the Government, stand by them to the end!

"Stand by the President" should and will be the slogan of this campaign. Stand by the flag, stand by the country, stand by the President, for those, during war time are synonyms.

"During the Civil War President Lincoln and his every political adviser, said, 'Stand by the President, stand by the flag, and stand by the country.' The Nation obeyed the summons. During the Spanish-American War, President McKinley, Theodore Roosevelt, and every political adviser, said, 'Stand by the President, and the country obeyed the summons.

"Today, in a war that is more far-reaching than all the rest, when the Nation in which we live is trembling from turret to foundation stone, there is but one appeal that should be made and heeded by every citizen of the land, of whatever political party, of whatever creed—Stand by the flag, stand by the country, stand by the President."

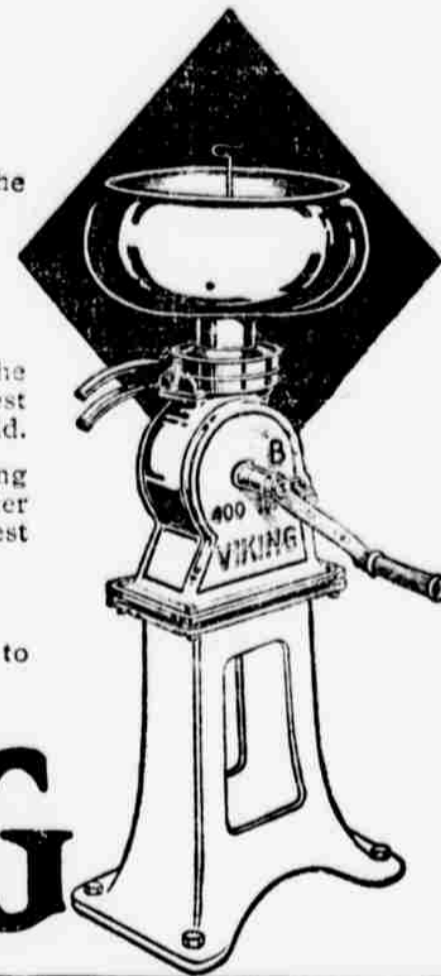
