ALLIES PREPARE PEACE TERMS FOR LESSER FOE

AWAIT A SUMMONS TO PARIS

Austrian Delegation Is Waiting to Hear Judgment Pronounced by Victorious Allies

Paris. - While the German peace plenipoter aries are digesting the text of the lengthy peace treaty and communicating with the Weimar government as to the demands made upon Germany by the allied and associated powers, the council of four is engaging itself with the formulation of peace terms for Austria and Hungary. The German-Austrian delegation is reported already to have started for St. Germain. France, there to await the summons to Versailles to learn what is to befall the one-time dual monarchy in the way of the payment of indemnities, the making of reparations and the relinquishment of territory. Estimates have been made in Paris that 5,000,000,000 crowns will be demanded as indemnity from Austria-Hungary in addition to the delimitation of frontiers. The pre-war debt of the former empire and kingdom, it is said, is to be divided among the newly formed states which have risen or are to arise in their old territories.

Meanwhile the German home government is expected to begin at once the consideration of the terms of peace which virtually reduce the German empire to the role of a minor power. Three courses seem to be open to the German government as indicated by recent dispathes. They may either accept the conditions of peace, or reject them or submit them to a plebiscite.

It is reported that when the terms of peace with Turkey are concluded the United States is to be requested to become the mandatory of Armenia, and that President Wilson will place the matter before congress in order that a decision may be arrived at.

Twelve Army Camps Sold

Washington.-Approval of the sale of twelve army camps—eight national guard concentration sites and four small miscellaneous camps—for a total of more than \$548,000, was announced by Acting Secretary of War Crowell. War department officials showed satisfaction over the results, the material covered by the sale consisting almost exclusively of hastily constructed buildings and some store equipment. The government reserved for its own use the base hospitals and storage warehouses. Forty-four bids were reseived from thirty-five individuals an corporations, the largest single proposal being from one large wrecking company which offered to take all the camps for a price approximately \$540,000. This proposal was rejected because of the desire of the department to turn over to cities adjacent to certain camps, the sanitary and other utilities which could be used advantageously for the benefit of their popu-

London. - The British government has recognized the independence of Finland and the de facto Finnish government, accroding to an announcement by the secretary for foreign affairs in the house of commons. The announcement was greeted with

New York. - Julius Barnes, United States wheat director, announced on his return from Chicago that he had completed negotiations for bring-4,000,000 bushels of Canadian wheat into the United States for distribution to the mills.

Extend Aerial Mail

Washington.-Air mail service between Cleveland and Chicago will be established May 15 with trips daily except Sunday. The postoffice department said the service would be extended to New York as soon as sufficient machines were obtained.

Hurrying Home From Europe Paris. - Numerous United States senators and representatives, including the house committee on military affairs, are taking early steamers for home to attend the extra session of congress which has been called for May 19.

Twister Visits Texas

Corpus Christi, Texas.-Fifteen persons were killed when one of the worst tornadoes ever experienced in southwest Texas swept the lower Rio Grande valley, demolishing farm houses and doing great damage to growing crops.

President Will Cable Message

Washington. — As President Wilson will not be present at the opening of the special session of congress on May 19 he will cable his message from Paris and it will be read immediately after congress convenes.

Furs Bring High Price St. Louis.-One hundred thousand mink pelts constituted the largest offering on the International fur exchange here. Prices at the morning session on mink ranged from \$2 for poor grades to \$19.75 for choice pelts.
