Inspiration to better living must be there, incentive to strive diligently for the highest ideals; and to attain these ends not only must the physical needs of the family be supplied moderately well, but the home must be attractive.

This attitude may be greatly altered by changed surroundings. Beauty in every form, has an influence for good. Forms of beauty differ greatly in their effect on persons.
