LIVESTOCK BREEDERS' PICNIC

Webster County's Improved Livestock Breeder's picnic was held at Guide Rock as per schedule. The early morning rain spoiled the basket dinner for those that had planned on this feature of the picnic. Steward took charge of the meeting and introduced for the first speaker, Dr. Woodring, Acting Chief of the Nebraska Bureau of Animal Industry. Dr. Woodring, talked for a short time on Tuberculosis Eradication and Hog Cholera Control. He urged the farmers to have their cattle tested and that way have clean milk for the family. On Hog Cholera he warned the farmers to look out for the out-break of Hog Cholera this fall, due to hogs being shipped in to eat up the cheap corn.

Ex-Governor A. C. Shallenberger gave one of his splendid talks which was worth going many miles to hear. In his talk he dealt a considerable length of time on the Livestock business.

Red Cloud Boosters for the Farmers' Institute attended the picnic and Father Fitzgerald extended the invitation to the Livestock Breeders and farmers to prepare and be represented at the Institute with an exhibit.
