Omaha Defense Crumbles in Eighth Inning

Saints Register Three Runs When Herd Makes Four Bobbles—Lindberg Winner.

Detroit, July 26.—Ty Cobb today was back in his old place at the head of the American league batters, leading George Sisler by 1 point.

The Tiger mounted the lead yesterday when, in five times up, he made four saeties, while his rival was getting 1 out of 3.

Four figures showed that in 81 games Cobb has been at bat 319 times, making 131 hits for an average of .412.

Cobb's admirers here feel confident he will retain the lead, for records show him at his best at the plate during July and August and they count on him piling up a safe lead during the 4 or 5 remaining weeks of hot weather.

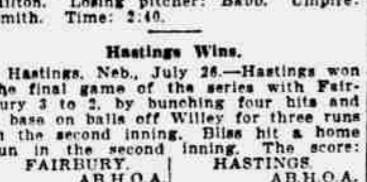
