Amid the silent conversations among the deaf mutes in the lobby of the hotel arises a burst of laughter or expression of joy from children of some parents sitting by. Then, occasionally, after a flutter of somatic fingers have made known some joke, there breaks forth from a youngster's lips, "Gee, ain't it funny?" or "I know one, too."

There are Homer and Grace Long, who live in Dandee, whose parents, Mr. and Mrs. Harry G. Long, are deaf mutes. But to hear Homer and Grace is ample evidence that they are blessed with speech and hearing.

Indian Pow-wow Draws Many 'Palefaces'

The great annual Omaha-Winnebago Indian pow-wow is going on daily at Macy, Neb., where it is attracting many "paleface" visitors to see the ancient dances handed down through so many generations of Indians that their original meaning is nearly forgotten.

But this year a new dance was added, the meaning of which is known and will be remembered for many generations. It is a sacred one called the Victory dance and was introduced by young braves of the tribes who were in the United States forces during the world war.

It was danced for the first time last Sunday. Both men and women participated. A strange blending of Indian finery and the white man's garments are noticeable in the garb worn in this dance. Some of the women wear moccasins, beaded leathern garments while others wear shoes, skirts and dresses of the white man's manufacture.

The pow-wow lasts until next Wednesday. Next Sunday is one of the big days. Macy is 70 miles from Omaha and many Omahans will drive there.

Dublin, Sept. 8.—(By A. P.)—Disagreement between two irregular leaders operating in County Kerry is reported to have caused a sanguinary fight in which rifles, bombs and machine guns were used by the opposing factions.

One leader, named McCellistrum, is said to have opposed plans for ambushing a food convoy enroute to the relief of Killarney, where the people are suffering from hunger, as a result of the irregulars' war on transports. Humphrey Murphy, another leader, differed on the issue with McCellistrum and the split spread to the ranks.

Washington, Sept. 8.—Roman justice was meted out when Glenn Harrison, police court bailiff, reported late for duty yesterday. Judge Robinson, his father, summoned him to the bar to explain his tardiness. The bailiff testified that he had accompanied some friends from Kentucky on a sightseeing tour.
