

### Relief Workers for Smyrna Hold Conference Here

#### Recent Massacre Discussed and Plans for Aiding Suffering People Outlined—Acheson Speaks.

Emergency relief funds for the Greek population in Asia Minor that are being created rapidly throughout the east, according to telegrams received at the regional conference of the Near East Relief workers yesterday at the Hotel Blackstone.

Discussion of the recent Smyrna massacre together with an outline of plans to aid the suffering people in the devastated areas took up yesterday afternoon's session.

**Prominent Workers Present.** Among the prominent workers of the Near East Relief association who were present at the conference were: Barclay Acheson, assistant general secretary; Alton E. Wilson, general field director; Dr. Andrew Melrose Brodie of Washington, national representative of the Near East Relief association; Dr. W. E. Donaghy of New York city, assistant general secretary; and Mrs. Florence Spencer Duryea, chairman of the women's committee of the organization.

Mr. Acheson and Mr. Wilson just returned to America recently from Smyrna.

**Both Issue Warning.** Dwelling upon conditions in the near east, both men were emphatic in their addresses yesterday that unless the United States lends early moral aid toward establishment of peace between the Turks and the Christian nations, the Constantinople will meet the same fate that befell Smyrna.

The conference will be continued throughout today at the Blackstone.

### Military Funeral for Red Cross Nurse

David City, Neb., Sept. 22.—(Special.)—Funeral services were held here for Miss Bessie Randall of this city, who died in a hospital in Chicago.

Miss Randall was a Red Cross nurse and served overseas for three years in Base Hospital No. 49. Her death was due to an injury received in an ambulance while in France. She was a graduate of the David City hospital, and was at one time head nurse.

A military funeral was held in the Methodist church, Rev. C. G. Bader officiating. The American Legion was in charge.

She is survived by her parents, Mr. and Mrs. H. D. Randall, and six sisters, Lena of Los Angeles, Cal.; Mrs. Birdswald of Omaha, Mrs. A. J. J. of David City, Mrs. Walter of Los Angeles, Agnes of Casper, Wyo., and Nellie, who resides in her parents' home.

### County Fair Is Success in All Departments

Lincoln, Neb., Sept. 22.—(Special.)—The Lincoln county fair, the most successful of recent years, closed yesterday. Notwithstanding the dry summer, the display of agricultural products was unusually large, due to the presence of the various displays for which liberal prizes were offered. The display of horses, cattle, hogs and poultry were also large. Amusement features were races by Lincoln county owned horses, and wild west stunts put on by the entertainers of the county.

Kearney, Neb., Sept. 22.—(Special.)—Bob Simmons, republican candidate for congress from the sixth district, spoke at a banquet here. Half of the crowd of 150 were women. Maude M. Burrows told of the state convention, and Mrs. Frank Vandewalker spoke on "Women in Politics."

Judge A. R. Humphrey of Broken Bow, republican candidate for the unexpired term of the late Congressman Moses P. Kinkaid, spoke optimistically of the outlook for a republican victory at the polls. Following the regular program, M. A. Brown and a number of others discussed plans and issues for the campaign. Legislative and county candidates also spoke.

### Avoca Woman Is Injured in Automobile Collision

Nebraska City, Neb., Sept. 22.—(Special.)—Mrs. John of Avoca suffered a fractured skull in an automobile collision on the O street road north of Palmyra. She was accompanied by her son-in-law, R. Other occupants of the Harshman car were slightly injured. Owing to the age of Mrs. St. John it is feared she cannot recover.

### Pastor Who Observes His 103d Birthday



Rev. G. G. Rice observed his 103d birthday anniversary yesterday at his home with his daughter, Mrs. D. W. Otis, 805 East Pierce street, Council Bluffs.

He is one of the oldest persons living in the United States. When he was born, September 22, 1819, Napoleon Bonaparte was still living, James Monroe was president of the United States, Abraham Lincoln was a 10-year-old boy, Gen. Grant was not yet born and the cities of Omaha and Council Bluffs were not even dreamed of.

Dr. Rice was born in Enosburg, Vt. He came to Council Bluffs in 1831 and founded the First Congregational church. Later he went to churches in Ouzma, Ia., and Hamanah, Kan., returning to Council Bluffs some years ago.

He spends most of his time in quiet meditation. His memory is good and his general health, aside from feebleness, is good.

Prof. M. B. Ogle of the University of Vermont, was one of his birthday visitors. Dr. Rice and his wife and three children are motoring to California and he stopped here to bring the greetings of the university of which Dr. Rice is the oldest living alumnus.

Last night there was a birthday party for Dr. Rice at which his children and grandchildren and other relatives were present.

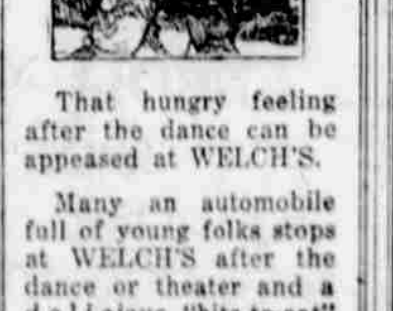
### Rosebud Rector Is New Episcopal Bishop

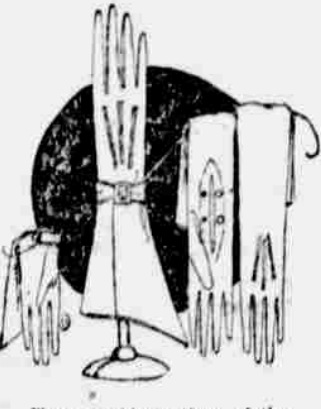

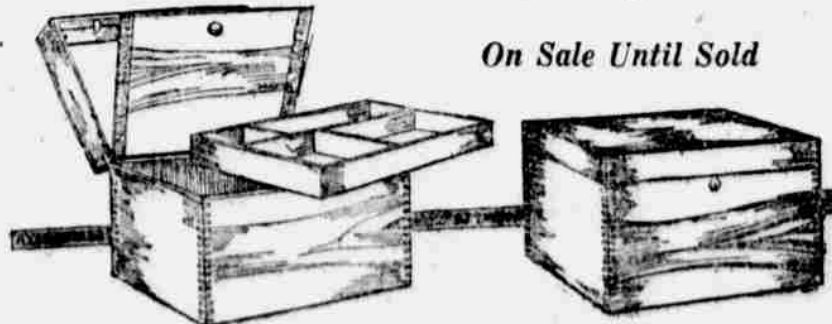
