These are ghisas, sail boats of the Nile.



One of the tragic scenes near Verdun, France, is the "Trench of the Bayonets." Here French infantrymen, killed by the shock of a big German shell, were buried under the accompanying shower of debris, only the bayonets left protruding. The trench of death has been preserved as an object lesson of horrors of war. Since the war Americans have erected a mausoleum over it.
