

National Guard Budget Increased

Funds to Train State Troops Increased \$10,000,000, Making Total \$33,910,000.

Washington, Oct. 20.—(Special)—The Nationalguard forces are to be well taken care of in the approaching army appropriation bill. The chief budget officer, it was learned today, has approved an increase of \$10,000,000 for the purpose of developing and training state troops.

Despite this increase, the army appropriation bill for the next fiscal year will be somewhat less than it was last year. The total sum to be asked for the training of National guard forces will be \$33,910,000. The citizens' training camps are to be taken care of with a proposed appropriation of \$2,930,150, which is expected to take care of 25,000 students. The estimates for the reserve officers' training camps will be \$1,491,000.

Army officers are complaining that

the proposed appropriation for reserve officers' training camps will not be adequate and a fight in congress is promised on this item. The estimates for this project call for an increase of only \$746,750. The item for reserve officers' instruction camps last year was \$1,000,000 and this year it is \$1,458,100.

The navy is having a hard fight with the chief budget officer in putting through its proposed increase of navy personnel of 10,000 men. The budget department is insisting the personnel be kept down to \$6,000 as provided for in the last appropriation. The navy is insistent the larger number of men is essential.

Mother of Several Children Accidentally Killed by Son

Mrs. Rosetta Wallace, mother of several children ranging in ages from 7 to 21 years, was accidentally killed in their home by a charge from a shotgun in the hands of Roscoe Wallace, 17, a son.

The Wallace home is on a farm 20 miles east of here.

A verdict of death by accident was returned.

U. S. Marines Land at Vladivostok

Terror Reigns as Jap Evacuation Continues; Jap Troops and Reds Clash.

Vladivostok, Oct. 20.—(By A. P.)—American and British marines were landed here today to guard the consulates of the two nations.

Tokyo, Oct. 20.—(By A. P.)—Terror reigns in Vladivostok as the completion of Japanese evacuation approaches, according to dispatches received here today.

Last night the city was plunged in darkness by the failure of the lighting plant. White guards roamed the streets in the darkness pillaging business houses and residences and holding up pedestrians.

On the outskirts of the town Japanese troops and red forces of the advancing for eastern republic army are reported to have clashed.

The original plan of the Japanese was to turn over the administration

of Vladivostok to the municipal government and to hold the reds outside the neutral zone until evacuation was completed. Then the municipal authorities refused to take possession of the war munitions left behind by the Japanese and the latter sought to open negotiations with the reds to give the republican troops control and thus avoid an interim of disorder. The China commanders refused to negotiate and the clash between the Japanese and Reds is reported to have followed.

Failure to Insert Date Costs Stanton Man \$1,500

Lincoln, Oct. 20.—(Special)—Failure to insert in his application for insurance the date on which he bought the truck he desired to insure with the National Automobile company of Lincoln cost W. R. Page, Stanton, \$1,500. By the time the omission was corrected and the policy sent to the local agent for delivery, the truck burned. Page got a judgment against the company on the ground of negligence, but the supreme court has overturned this and dismissed the case. It says that Page's application took its turn with others, and there was no unreasonable delay. It adds that if he had obeyed the injunction, printed in bold

type in the application, to answer all questions when he first filled it out, he would not have lost out.

Deputy Marshal Believed Victim of Poison Plot

Tulsa, Okla., Oct. 20.—Officers announced they were proceeding on the theory that death was caused by poisoning in the case of United States Deputy Marshal George Hanna, who died late Thursday in a local hotel under mysterious circumstances.

A daughter of the veteran officer declared that her father, before he lost consciousness, told her that he was poisoned and gave the names of two women. A bottle which was found in Hanna's hotel room, contained a mixture of corn whiskey and

poison, the police chemist said.

Veteran Editor Dies

Dyersburg, Tenn., Oct. 20.—Col. Tom W. Neal, 87, nestor of Tennessee Journalism, for years editor and proprietor of the State Gazette here and a city editor in Nashville in civil war days, is dead here.
