

Stolen Goods Cache Is Found on Farm

Nebraska City, Neb., Oct. 25.—(Special)—Several hundred dollars worth of merchandise, consisting of clothing, shoes, ammunition and automobile accessories, was found buried in the farm of Roy Babcock, several

miles south of this city by officers from the sheriff's office and police department, when they searched the place looking for liquor. The goods were identified as having been stolen from an Elk Creek (Neb.) store a few nights ago.

William Welter, young farmer residing near Paul, and Rudolph Kreifels of Lincoln, formerly of this community, were arrested in Lincoln

on orders from the Otoe county sheriff and are held here in connection with the burglary.

Babcock, at whose home the goods were found, informed the officers that a few days ago he met Welter and Jacy Banker near his home and they told him of hiding the goods on his land, but that he was not informed as to where they had obtained the goods.

Banker is supposed to be in Omaha. Both Walters and Kreifels deny that they know anything of the goods but the former admits that he was in Elk Creek the day before the robbery in company with Jacy Banker.

President Denies Creamery Insolvent

After denying that the company is insolvent or has committed any act of bankruptcy, Corlies asks for jury trial on the question of receivership. The petition answered one filed by creditors October 9.

Court will be convened October 31 and a docket will be made up then.

Another petition concerning the Waterloo company was filed yesterday by Herman Schunke, Omaha,

who said he was a former creditor of the concern, having held a judgment for \$9,325.60. He stated it was a provable claim, that he collected, and that the concern is not insolvent.

O'Connor Conviction Is Appealed to High Court

Lincoln, Oct. 25.—(Special)—James B. O'Connor, convicted in Adams court

of having uttered a false will, filed appeal with the supreme court and secured an order suspending his sentence upon his giving bond in the district court. O'Connor was one of the claimants of the John O'Connor estate, and claiming to be a nephew presented a will for probate that was rejected by the courts.
