Washington, Nov. 1 .- Indications of rapidly improving conditions in the country's general business life were given today in reports to the car serv ice section of the American Railway association, which, among other things, showed the greatest weekly loading of freight from which the rallroads derived revenue in two

The reports disclosed that, with the exception of four weeks in September and October, 1920, the loading of 1. 003,759 cars of revenue freight the week of October 21, was the greatest

Record in Car Loadings.

A record of 596,392 cars loaded with merchandise and miscellaneous freight which includes manufactured products also, was established during the week. the association reported. This was an an increase of 36,554, while it was 29,-230 cars more than for the corresponding week last year.


