Writers Say American Team 'Threw' Game

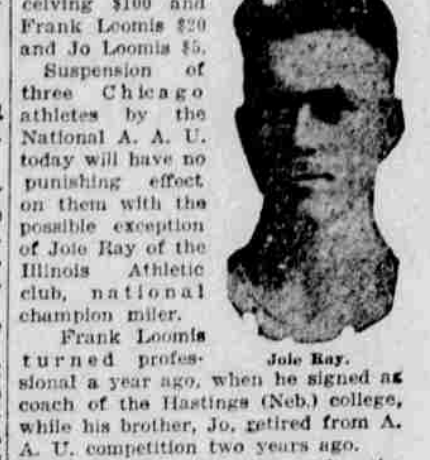
