Congress to Probe Klan Activities in Capital City

Representative Asks Investigation of Charges That Officials Have Joined "Invisible Empire."

Washington, Nav. 25 -- Representaive Rainey, Illinois, introduced a resolution to create a joint congressional ommittee to investigate charges that the Ku Klux Klan, in full regalia, initiated a high official of the federal government in the capitol building at midnight on November 14.

The resolution called attention to a ewspaper dispatch from Atlanta tellg of initiation ceremonies staged by ne klan not only in the capitol but other federal buildings in Washngton as well, including the War de-

The preamble of the resolution de clares that "the best interests of the people of the United States demand a strict adherence and sole allegiance to the laws of the United States," and that "members of the Ku Klux Klan take an oath of allegiance to the invisible empire which, upon rumerous occasions, have taken the law into their own hands and without trial by court or jury inflicted punishment and trages upon United States citizens." The proposed investigating commit de will consist of three senators and four representatives. They would be directed to inquire fully into the harges and to make their report to oth houses for whatever action might
