The Commissioners Doing All Possible to Make a Good Showing for the Law.

A Washington special of the 14th says: The civil service law went into operation on the 16th of July. Since which date all the appointments to clerkships in the the examination of applicants, but in requiring the heads of the departments to concede every demand made in the name of civil service reform. The law having been rigidly enforced for about four months, a correspondent has made inquiries in the several departments as to its practical effect upon the civil service, and whether it was giving to the government the services of a better class of the offices in which they are appointedthan would have been the case had the former system remained in vogue. In the treasury department there have been nine males and three females appointed in conformity with the law, having been successful in the competitive examinations. These are all pronounced by their superior officers to be good clerks-two or three of them superior clerks, but this is regarded as largely due to have induced many to try it with the best of the fact that nearly every one has previously been in the government service, and therefore familiar, to a great extent, with the duties required of them. So far as the treasury department is concerned, the officials do not feel justified as yet in saying that the clerks to be appointed under the civil service rules will be an improvement upon those who would have received appointments under the former system, because the full effect of the new law will not be felt until a number of clerks who previously had no experience in the government service are appointed and tried in a practical way.

In the interior department between thirty and thirty-five vacancies have occurred since the existence of the civil service commission, but these have all been filled by the transfer of clerks from the census office, where the work is rapidly being drawn to a close. This has obviated the necessity of making new appointments, and although the civil service commissioners do not altogether relish it, yet the as department secures experienced and competent clerks, they have to bear it.


