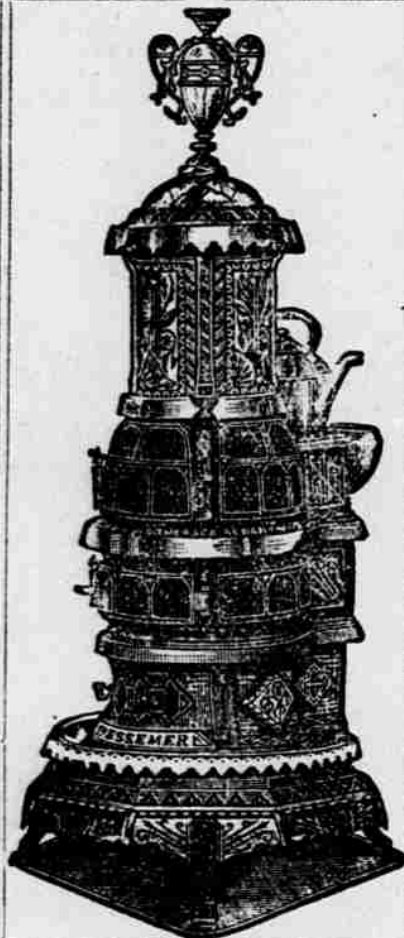

fighting one another.

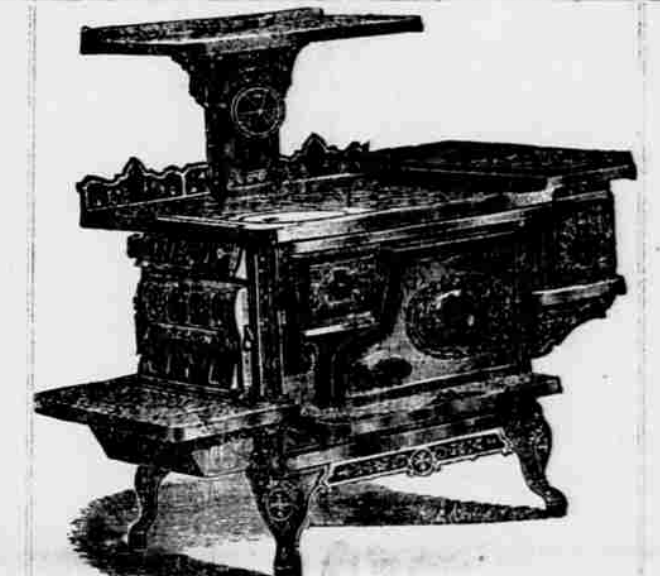
