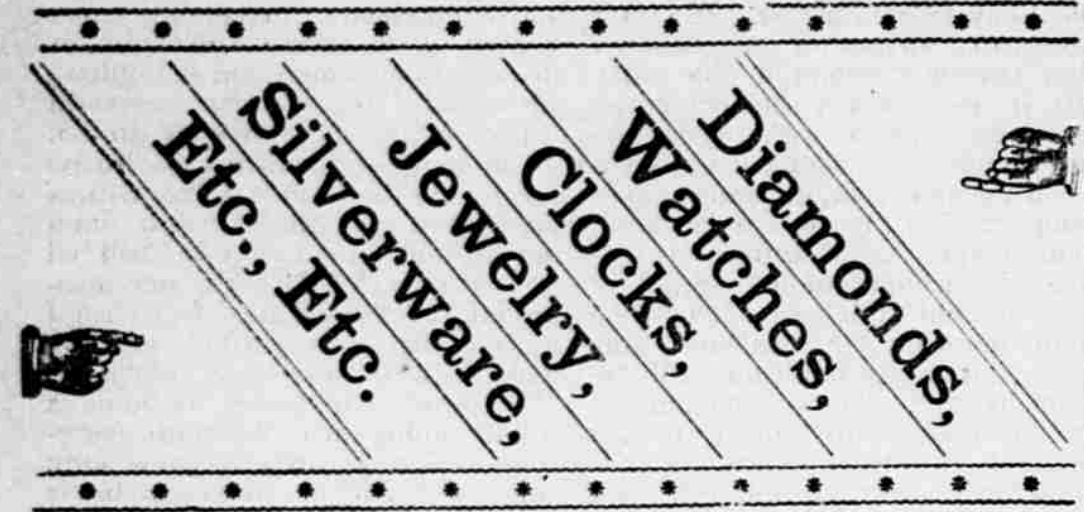

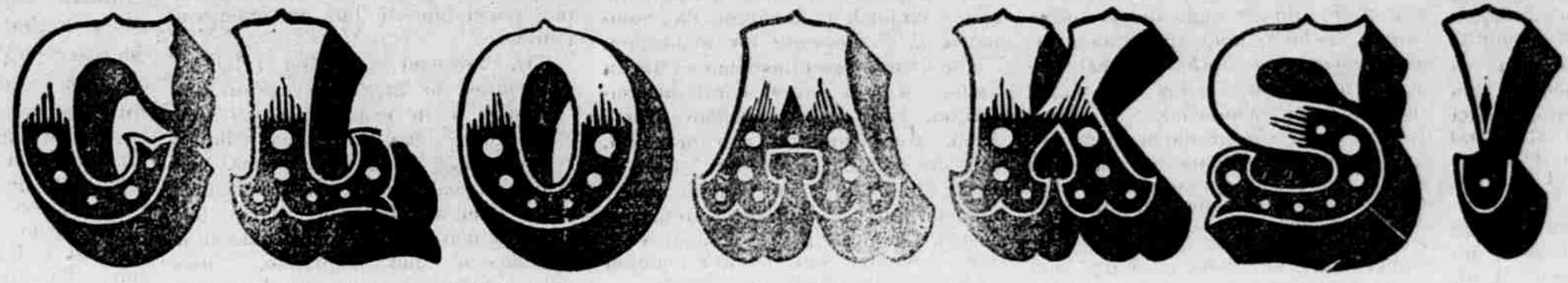

"All things come to him who waits." is a maxim that a Boston inventor has kept in his mind. A few years ago he invented a soldering iron that superseded the old slow process of sealing tin cans by soldering the top on the can by one movement which was a simple pressure of the iron upon the surface of the top. After getting his patent he took no particular pains to manufacture and introduce it, and the consequence was that his patent was stolen by nearly all the big canning establishments in the country who have used it right along. The other day he woke up and brought a test suit against a factory before the United States circuit court. The court awarded him compensation for the use of his soldering iron at the rate of \$15 per thousand cans. He is now ready to settle with every one at the same rate. It is said that if he pursues the owners to the bitter end they will have to pay over to him about \$50,000,000. This is a bigger sum than he could have made probably if he had pushed his business and sold the soldering iron to the canning factories from the beginning. He perhaps foresaw that there was more money in being infringed upon.

The dry cold weather of the early winter months is productive of a great deal of croup among children. Mothers should be on the lookout for it, and be prepared to arrest it as soon as the first symptoms appear. True croup never comes without a warning; a day or two before the attack the child will become hoarse, and that symptom is soon followed by a peculiar rough cough. 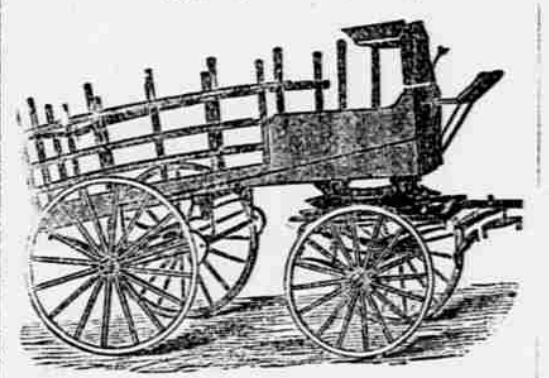

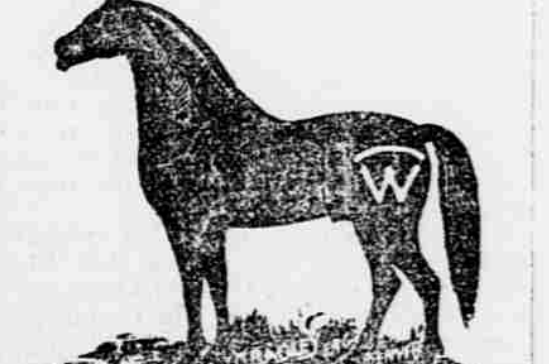
