ASSESSORS' MEETING.

In accordance with law and pursuant to call of county clerk, the assessors of Red Willow county assembled in court house in Indianola, Nebraska, at 10 o'clock, A. M., March 19th, 1889, for the purpose of adopting a schedule and fixing a price from which to assess taxable property in said county. On motion Mr. C. J. Ryan was elected chairman and W. M. Rollins, secretary. All precincts not being represented an adjournment was taken until 1 o'clock, P. M. House called to order, 1 o'clock, after which the secretary read schedule adopted last year, article by article. On motion the following schedule was adopted for the year 1889:

Cattle of all ages \$2.00 to \$10.00, calves and blooded stock ½ cash value.
Mules and asses, ½ cash value.
Sheep, common, from 25 to 50 cts. per head, blooded 1.00.
Hogs of all ages, 1 ct. per pound.
All wheeled vehicles at from \$2.00 to \$5.00.
Sewer and nitting machines, 1.00 to \$3.00.
Pianos, organs and musical instruments, ½ cash value.
All property to be listed under schedule, list of personal property under numbers, 24, 25, 26, 27, 28, 29, 30, 31, and 32, ½ cash value.
Investments in real estate improvements: Land 50 cts. to \$2.00, over three miles from town or under three miles, from 50 cts. to \$1.00, per acre.
All grain to be assessed at ½ cash value.
All personal property not enumerated, ½ cash value.
