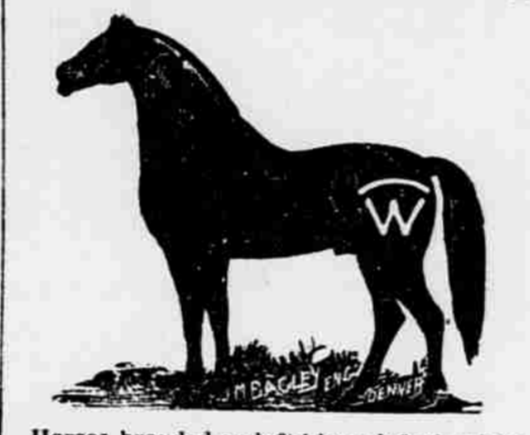
OFFICE: In the B & M. Meat Market, where he will always be pleased to see his old customers as usual.
