McCook, Nebraska, October 26th, 1898.
Board of county commissioners met pursuant to adjournment; present, Stephen Bolles, Jas. A. Robinson and Henry Crabtree, commissioners, Harlow W. Keyes, county attorney and R. A. Green, county clerk. Minutes of previous meeting read and approved. The following official bond examined and on motion approved: W. G. Higby, overseer road dis. 30. The proposition of C. H. Meeker for renting of county offices, was on motion rejected. Proposition of H. C. Rider for same purpose taken under advisement. On motion the affidavits of Henry Crabtree relating to personal tax were accepted as prayed for, and the same ordered placed on file.

ROAD NO. 329.
Petition of M. C. Stephens et al. asking for the location of a public road read and considered. The board find that all the requirements of law have been fully complied with, and on motion, petition is granted and road established as follows: Commencing at the northwest quarter of section one, township 2, north range 26, running thence west on section line to northeast corner of section 3, thence south on section line 150 rods to a stake, thence southeast 108 rods to a stake, thence southwest 32 rods to a stake, thence west to a stake on section line between sections 2 and 3, 28 rods north of the southwest corner section 2, thence south on section line to the southwest corner of northwest quarter of section 11, township 1, north, range twenty-six (26) west 6th P. M. all in Red Willow county, Nebraska. 235 per acre was granted the claimants Martha E. and J. B. 
