Home for Families of Bandits.

Not actuated by remorse, but by pure philanthropy, Jim Jenkins, hunter of outlaws, has concluded to devote all his money to the maintenance of a home for the orphans and widows of men he has run to earth, in particular, and of criminals of the great Southwest in general. Jim Jenkins, now of Kansas, is now 65 years old and has spent forty years as a scout and hunter of bandits and train robbers. In this way he has made about \$50,000. Among the distinguished outlaws he has chased were Jesse James and his brother, Bob Ford, Bill Dalton and Bill Cook, while he was the leader of the band that caught Cherokee Bill in 1895. In the Dalton raid in Coffeyville, Kas., Jenkins was shot eight times. He estimates his bag of bad men at about 150. The home, which is being built on a 5,000-acre farm owned by Jenkins, near Pryor Creek, I. T., is to cost \$20,000.—Buffalo Express.

Subsidies to Support Art.

The government of Bavaria has voted a considerable sum for the maintenance of art institutions throughout the kingdom during the coming year. The allowances for the purchase of paintings and their preservation is particularly liberal. The various art institutes in Munich receive handsome subsidies and the Germanic museum in Nuremberg gets an increased allowance. Various other institutions have been voted large amounts for repairs and maintenance. These art allowances in all reach 3,108,163 marks (\$739,741).—Emil Henzel, in Chicago Record.

Mistakes Made at the Mint.

John Erhard of Philadelphia has a coin dated 1891, which has a head on either side, showing that mistakes are made even at the mint. Every finished coin passes through the hands of a great many experts, and there is little chance of an imperfect piece escaping this scrutiny. There are said to be many of them in circulation, however. No particular value is attached to the coins outside of their rarity as curiosities.

Milk Attracts Disease Germs.

Place a jug of milk near fish for a few hours and there will be a fishy flavor about it. In this same way that milk is susceptible to odors, so it attracts disease germs; diphtheria, typhoid fever, etc., are often contracted in this manner. This is not always due to carelessness, for these bacilli are in the very air we breathe. The only true safeguard when contagious disease is about to sterilize the milk.

Indiana's Gold and Silver.

Excitement of the wildest character prevails in Warwick county, Indiana, over the discovery of gold and silver near Lynnville. The land where the ore has been found is of the poorest, but owners are paying up back taxes in the hope of realizing handsomely. Hotels and restaurants are crowded with strangers and many more are arriving daily.

Water Supply for Tampico.

English engineers are making surveys and plans of Tampico and the surrounding country with a view of supplying the town with drinking water and a complete system of sewerage. Should these works be carried out there will be an excellent opening for the sale of plumbing supplies. At present there is no plumbing establishment in the port.

Within 800 Miles of Pole.

Dr. G. E. Borchgrevink has made a great advance into the colder and more perilous Antarctic regions, carrying the line of exploration to within 600 miles of the south pole.

Tomsk a University Town.

A technological institute has been opened at Tomsk. This is the second institution for higher education in Siberia. Tomsk is now a university town.
