



In this same way that milk is susceptible to odors, so it attracts disease germs; diphtheria, tpphoid fever, etc., are often contracted in this manner. This is not always due to carelessness, for these bacilli are in the very air we breathe. The only true safeguard when contagious disease is about to sterilize the milk.
