University State News Notes. The annual exhibit of the Nebraska Art Association will open during the Christmas holidays and continue for a month. Members of the Nebraska Teachers' Association will be admitted to the Art Exhibit free.

A reception was tendered the Omaha Department of the University Medical College at the Millard Hotel, Omaha, by Chancellor and Mrs. Andrews and Dean and Mrs. H. B. Ward. Friday evening, December 5th.

Clarence T. Johnson, Assistant Chief of Irrigation Investigation, U. S. Department of Agriculture, delivered an illustrated lecture on "Irrigation in Egypt" before the University Engineering Society, Thursday, December 4th.

Samples of syrup, manufactured from beets by a company in Sioux City, Iowa, have been received by the university for analysis. This company believes that they have discovered a method of obtaining syrup directly from sugar beets.

A. E. Sheldon of the State Historical Society is now in St. Louis, Mo., seeking information concerning early steamboating on the Missouri. This is the principal topic to be discussed at the annual meeting of the Historical Society to be held at Lincoln during the holidays. He will also look up interesting material concerning the earliest fur traders in Nebraska.

The attendance in the University Medical School now numbers forty seven persons in the first two years at Lincoln, and 112 in the Omaha Department, making a total of 159. At the beginning of the second semester, February 1st, it is expected that many new students will enter, and also that a number of students in the other departments of the University will adapt their work so as later to enter the College of Medicine. The combined six year course, which leads to the degree of Bachelor of Science as well as the degree of M. D. meets with general approval. By this arrangement a student not only receives the technical training in medicine, but a broad general foundation. Students who enter February first will find that they have one advantage when they graduate four years hence. Finishing their work in February they will anticipate by several months the graduation of the great mass of students from a hundred medical colleges. It is a fact that many positions are open to young medical graduates in the early spring. To the student graduating at the mid-year commencement, this affords a rare opportunity. Any student who thinks of entering the College of Medicine and is now prepared to do so, should not wait until next September, but correspond with the University at once. All the arrangements can easily be made now and the student enters in February without any necessary delay.
