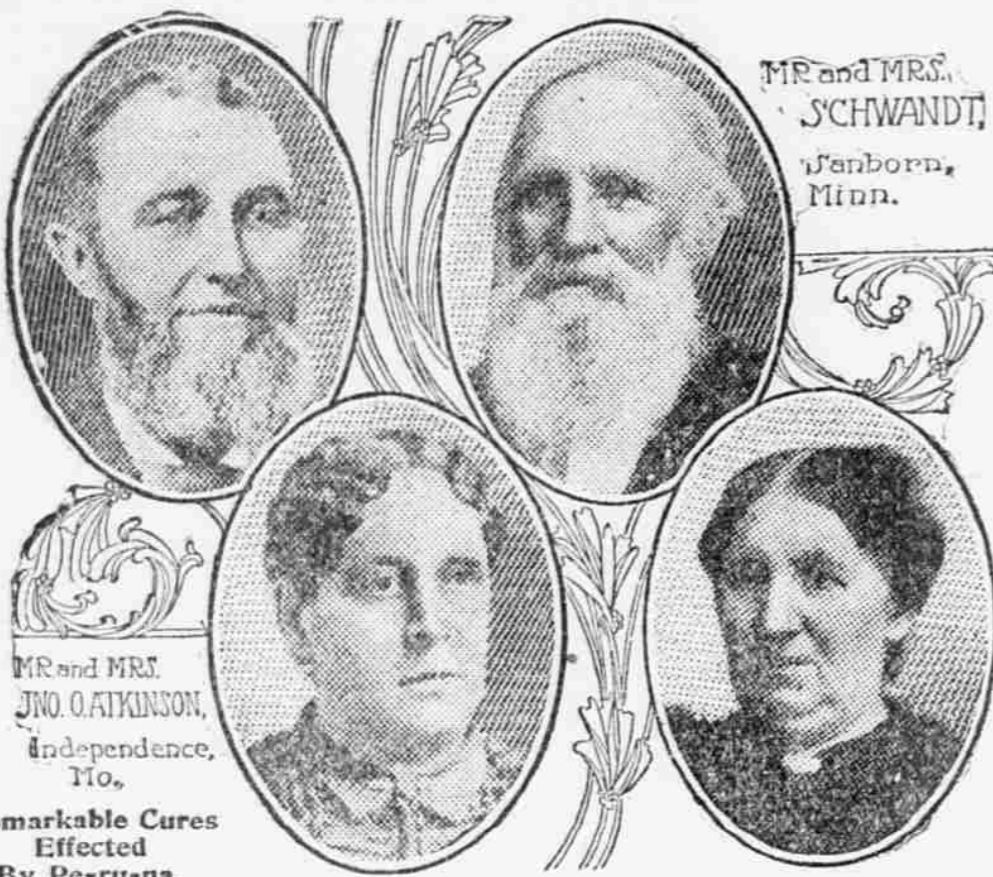

Nebraska News

Fire in the Murphy block at Table Rock did \$500 worth of damage. Hiram Wallace of Adams county has been adjudged insane and sent to the asylum.

Samuel Wymore and son have purchased a diamond drill and expect to sink 2,000 feet in the vicinity of Wymore in search of oil.

Dorr Brainard, a young farmer living between Seward and Tamora, had his left hand caught in a cornsheller and it was practically torn off.

The schools in the village of Palmyra have been closed on account of the prevalence of diphtheria among the children who have been attending them.

While in the act of lifting the cover from a can of boiling coffee, which exploded, Mrs. Lena Whitcomb of Beatrice was quite severely burned about the face and eyes.

Henry Hurst, the landlord of the Prince hotel at Madison, who had been acting strangely for some time, was taken to Lincoln, where he was placed in a private sanitarium.

William Buerstetta, a merchant of Tecumseh, was kicked in the side by his family horse and quite badly injured. Two ribs were broken and the man may be injured internally.

Robert O. Stewart, who has been working in the Burlington freight depot at Hastings since the first of the year, was placed under arrest to answer charge of embezzlement.

During the farmers' institute at Geneva on March 2 and 3 the Equal Suffrage club will serve a corn festival, at which all the edibles will be composed of corn in some delectable shape.

At Lincoln Mrs. Mark Woods told the story of the loss of her diamonds, valued at \$800, in a Pullman car last summer. In the district court she is suing for the price of her jewels.

The farmers of Adams county are talking of organizing for the purpose of holding a big county fair next fall. A meeting will soon be called when officers will be elected and all necessary arrangements made for the affair.

Rev. D. A. Youtzy, pastor of the Christian church at Plattsmouth, has received a call from the Home Missionary society to go to Porto Rico as a missionary, but has not fully decided to accept.

Schinstock Bros., the noted shippers and breeders of horses, are now in St. Joseph, Mo., disposing of several carloads of Nebraska draft horses, all raised in Cuming county. This firm is building up an immense export trade in horses and affording a ready and profitable market for the breeders of horses in Cuming county for their surplus stock.

At a meeting of the state banking board it was agreed to turn over the complaints against several installment investment companies to Attorney General Brown for investigation. Mr. Brown was given authority to conduct investigations and to bring proper action to suppress the companies violating the law. A number of complaints have been received lately.

An ordinance was introduced in the city council of Nebraska City requiring all the railroads entering that city to place a flagman at all places where their tracks cross the streets. The ordinance provides a penalty of \$25 for each twenty-four hours that the companies neglect to keep flagmen at the crossings.

The government geological department at Washington has evidently heard of Cass county's "coal mine." J. W. Thomas, the owner, has received a letter from the department asking him to forward some samples of his coal and coal tar products. He has also been requested to send samples to the state university. During the coming summer Mr. Thomas expects to employ an experienced miner to sink a drift and make a thorough investigation of the discovery.

Mr. and Mrs. Allen Barnes of Pawnee county last week celebrated their golden wedding.

The twenty-fifth annual state convention of the Young Men's Christian association of Nebraska came to a close at Grand Island with services at the Presbyterian church. The following officers of the state committee were elected: W. J. Hill, Lincoln, chairman; W. O. Henry, Omaha, vice chairman; George C. Wallace, Omaha; secretary; and M. C. Steele, Omaha, treasurer.

A number of young farmers of Richardson county are preparing to leave early next month, in company with others from adjoining counties, for Canada, where they will take up their residence on land upon which they made filings last summer.

At Chadron Eva Loomer, a girl of 16, had a novel, but not pleasant experience. She was sitting near the stove and a celluloid comb which she was wearing in her hair started to blaze, burning about a quarter of her abundant hair before the fire was smothered by a cool-headed member of the family.

A son of Fred Oelke, south of Nebraska City, fell as he was climbing down from a load of hay and struck his head against the tines of a pitchfork. One of the tines entered his left eye and penetrated to the brain. He died soon after.

Cyrus King of Louisville, Cass county, endeavored to convince the examining board that he was a first-class penman and vocalist, but as his penmanship was scarcely legible and his singing badly out of tune they decided that the asylum was the proper place for the patient, who is only 22 years of age.
