Kansas City, October 18, 1905.

Receipts of cattle thus far this month are 210,200; last year 181,600. Monday's market for beefs was mostly ten cents lower; cows and heifers steady and active; stockers and feeders steady to weak. Trade was slow with prices steady to weak for everything on Tuesday, and today with receipts of 16,500; trade for beef cattle was active and firm for natives with westerns slow and weak. Cows were active and steady; stockers and feeders dull. The following table gives quotations now ruling:

Receipts of hogs thus far this month are 132,100; last year, 06,600. Monday's market was weak to lower but closed firm; Tuesday's trade was 2 1/2 to five cents lower and today with receipts of 13,000 was steady to a shade lower, bulk of sales ruling from \$5.15 to \$5.20; top \$5.30.

Receipts of sheep thus far this month are 96,800; last year, 89,200. Monday's market was strong for sheep and ten to fifteen cents higher on lambs. Tuesday's trade was strong for all offerings and today with 2,500 on sale, prices were steady. We quote: choice lambs \$7.25 to \$7.50; choice yearlings, \$5.25 to \$5.50; choice wethers, \$5.00 to \$5.25; choice ewes, \$4.50 to \$4.75.
