Evert Rutledge's sale last Tuesday was not very well attended and every thing went cheap.

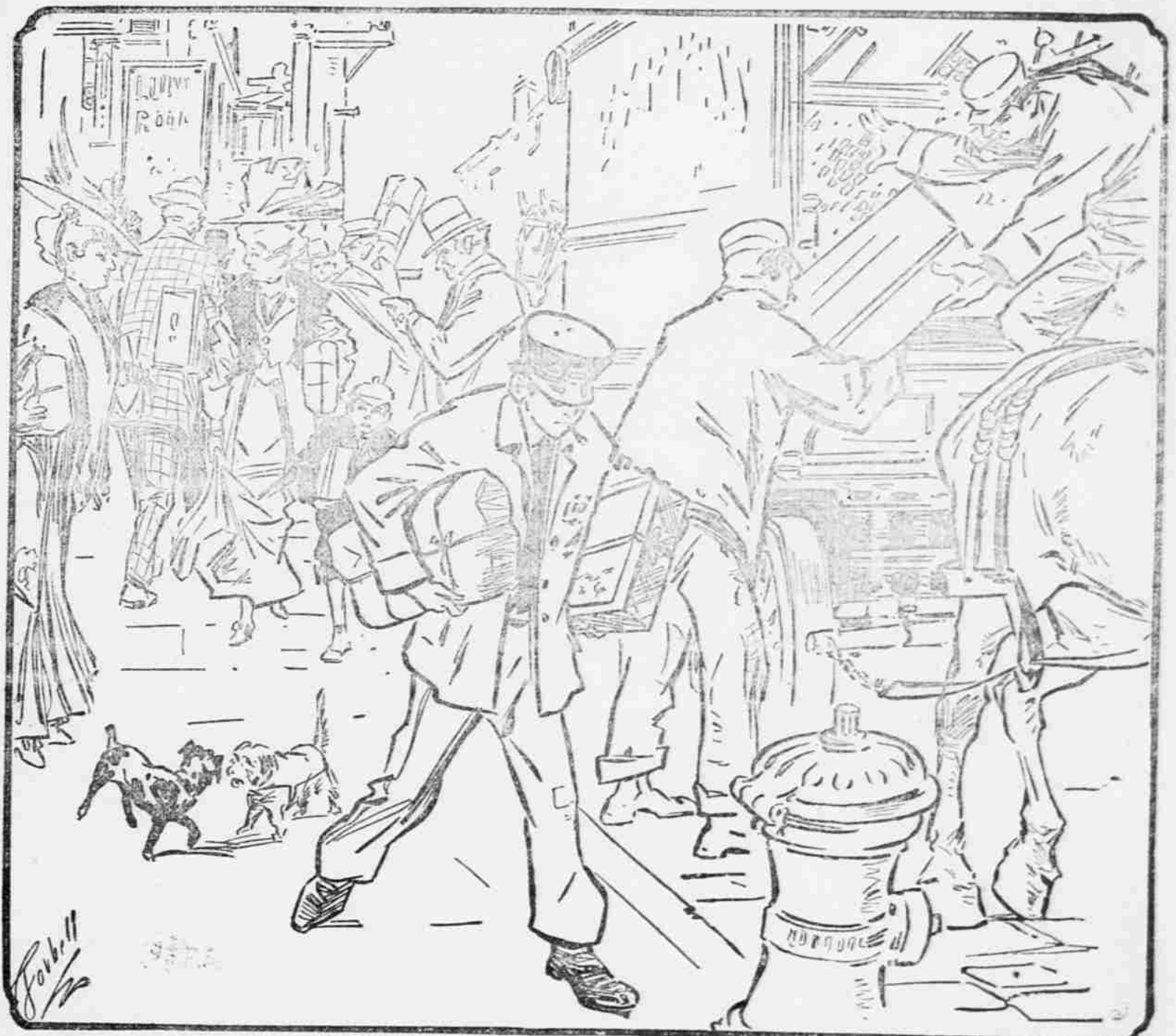
Quite a number of the men from this neighborhood have been attending court this week.
