NOTICE OF SPECIAL TAX ELECTION.

Notice is hereby given to the qualified electors of the County of Red Willow in the State of Nebraska, that upon the order of the Board of County Commissioners of the County of Red Willow in the State of Nebraska, an election will be held on the eighth day of November, A. D. 1910, between the hours of eight o'clock a. m. and six o'clock p. m. of said day, at the voting places in the several voting precincts of said county, where the general election for the year 1910 shall be held, for the purpose of voting on the following proposition, which is hereby submitted to the qualified electors of said county, to-wit:

Shall the Board of Equalization of the County of Red Willow in the State of Nebraska levy a tax for the year 1911 for the purpose of creating a fund, with which to purchase land, erect and furnish buildings thereon suitable for a poor house and to put into operation and defray the actual expenses of such poor house; said tax to be levied for the year 1911 only, and at the rate of three mills on each dollar of the assessed valuation of the taxable property of said county, which three mills shall be in addition to the taxes, which said Board of Equalization is authorized to levy for county purposes, to-wit: one dollar and fifty cents per one hundred dollars valuation of the property of said county?
